

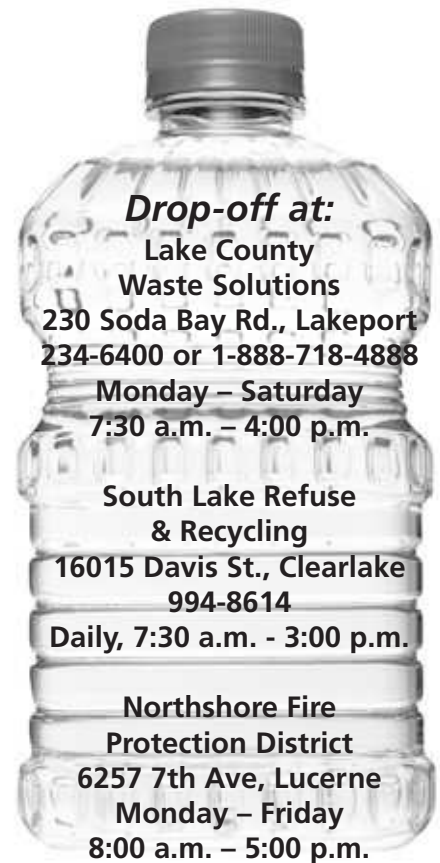
# Drop-Off Used Cooking Oil for Recycling

Cooking oils and grease should not be poured down drains as they build-up on the inside of pipes and is a major contributor to clogged sink drains, sewer lines, and septic systems, which may require costly repairs. While cooking oil can be disposed of in the trash, it is a valuable commodity and can be recycled into fuel.

Oils that can be accepted include olive, soybean, canola, etc. – any vegetable cooking oil that is liquid at room temperature. Bacon grease cannot be accepted. Free to residents and businesses.
